## Instructions for keeping glass clean in top door

- 1. Once the glass has been etched and is cloudy it cannot be cleaned, but should be kept in a dry place when the stove is not in use. The fly ash causes this condition and it can be prevented by weekly or bi-weekly cleaning and application of 100% pure silicone spray as outlined in this procedure.
- 2. A door cover will be required for compliance with these instructions, this part is standard with the Pioneer, Hearth and All American Heater stoves and can be purchased here:

- 3. After installation of a new top door glass apply silicone to interior surface of glass and rub thoroughly with paper towel to ensure an even, clear coating.
- 4. Silicone can be purchased here: <u>https://leisurelinestove.com/product/silicone-spray-for-glass/</u>
- 5. Once every week or two open the top door, place the door cover over the opening.
- 6. Allow the door to cool so that it can be touched without discomfort
- 7. While the door is still warm use a clean, damp paper towel to thoroughly clean the interior surface of the glass.
- 8. Re-Apply the silicone spray to the interior surface of the glass as described in step 3. Above.

<u>CAUTION!</u> The door cover will be very hot after being on the stove, use appropriate heat insulated gloves to handle it.

- 9. Carefully remove the door cover and set it carefully on a noncombustible surface to cool.
- 10. Close the stove top door
